The teachers were learning and growing together over a bee staff meeting as well.





Pūrākau

For the past year, our school has been part of the Kura Ahurea programme, delivered through Te Wharewaka o Poneke. This programme provides a Te Ātiawa ki Te Tara/Taranaki Whanganui а Whānui perspective on local historical narratives, tikanga and kawa. Last Thursday we were thrilled to have a visit from Sharee Adam, one of the kaiako for the programme. Sharee shared a pūrākau (stories) with the classes. Students had a great time acting out parts of the story. There were some really entertaining 'battles' between the wind, the forest and the ocean, as children retold the Battle of the Elements. Teachers enjoyed the opportunity to observe and learn from Sharee.

Science Opportunity

On Wednesday some of our enthusiastic Year 4 and 5 scientists had an opportunity to learn from Tianyi, the 2024 Academic Prefect for Scots College. Tianyi led the students through four activities and then explained the science behind each activity. Each activity focused on a different area of science. The spherification activity was a particular hit with the students. The children were really engaged and asked some great questions.
